# **Biosecurity Bill**

Robust biosecurity measures play an essential role in protecting our economy, environment and community from the impacts of pests and diseases.

### **General Biosecurity Duty**

The draft Biosecurity Bill aims to build a culture of shared responsibility. Central to this is that everyone has a 'general biosecurity duty'.

### What is my duty?

You must:

- prevent
- manage eliminate
- minimise

risks where you know there is a biosecurity risk

### When do I have a duty?

If you deal with biosecurity matter or a carrier where reasonably practicable.



### How do I know what to do?

By referring to:

- quidelines and advisory material
- codes of practice and industry standards
- specified biosecurity requirements.

\* These Acts will be repealed to create the Biosecurity Act. Specific provisions regarding aquatic pests in the *Fisheries Management Act* 2007 are also proposed to be incorporated into the Biosecurity Bill.

### Responding to increasing risks nationally and globally

- Climate change is enabling pests and diseases to invade new areas.
- Movement of more goods and people through trade and tourism is increasing the risks of pest incursion and spread.
- **E-commerce** is enabling greater volumes of trade, including illegal trade in declared pest species.
- Serious diseases like foot and mouth disease. African swine fever and lumpy skin disease are spreading and getting closer to Australia.
- Increasing resistance to agricultural and veterinary chemicals could limit our options to prevent and manage pests and diseases.

### **Biosecurity matter**

Biosecurity matter includes:

- any living thing, part of a living thing or product of a living thing (other than a person)
- a disease or contaminant
- a disease agent that can cause disease.



### **Biosecurity carrier**

A carrier is:

- any thing (other than a person) that can have biosecurity matter on, attached to or contained within it
- includes things worn or carried by a person.
