

Fisheries Management (Marine Scalefish Fishery) Regulations 2017

For the purpose of regulation 35 relating to Periodic Returns – I make the following determinations –

Regulation 35(1) (provide return)

- (1) The holder of a licence in respect of the Marine Scalefish Fishery must—
- (a) complete a return form (return) contained within the South Australian Commercial Marine Scalefish and Miscellaneous Fisheries Daily Catch and Effort Logbook, in respect of each calendar month during the currency of the licence; and
 - (b) include in the return such information as is required in the form; and
 - (c) date and sign the return and certify that the information contained in the return is complete and accurate, and deliver the return to the Department using one of the following methods;
 - (i) A Reply Paid envelope issued with the logbook,
 - (ii) Post the return to
 - South Australian Research and Development Institute
 - SA Aquatic Sciences
 - PO Box 120
 - Henley Beach SA 5022, or
 - (iii) Deliver to a Primary Industries and Regions SA office,
- within 15 days of the end of the month to which it relates.

- (2) The holder of a licence in respect of the Marine Scalefish Fishery that has a condition fixing a sardine quota entitlement must—
- (a) Complete a return form contained within the South Australian Sardine Fishery Research Logbook, in respect of each calendar month during the currency of the licence; and
 - (b) Deliver the return to;
 - South Australian Research and Development Institute
 - SA Aquatic Sciences
 - PO Box 120
 - Henley Beach SA 5022, or
- within 15 days of the end of the month to which it relates.

(3) If the holder of a licence takes no aquatic resources of a particular class under the licence during a particular calendar month, he or she is required to furnish a return form in respect of that period indicating that no such aquatic resources were taken unless—

(a) the holder of the licence complied with this clause of this determination in respect of the calendar month in which aquatic resources of that class were last taken under the licence.

(4) If the fishery has been closed for a whole calendar month, the holder of a licence need not furnish a return for that month.

Regulation 35(2) (keeping of records)

The holder of a licence must—

(a) make a copy of each return that he or she completes under this determination before the return is sent or delivered; and

(b) retain the copy for a period of 12 months from the last day of the month to which the return relates.
