Information that is not within the scope of your request has been removed from Documents 1 and 3.

Clause 6(1) states:

“6 - Documents affecting personal affairs

(1) A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the disclosure of which would involve the unreasonable disclosure of information concerning the personal affairs of any person (living or dead).”

The personal information removed consists of the following:

- Name, email address and identifiable information of the author of correspondence to the Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development
- Name and identifiable information of a third party
- Mobile telephone number of a Departmental officer

It is considered that members of the public can correspond with a Minister without fear that their identities are released.

As a mobile telephone number allows a person, including an officer of an agency, to be contacted outside of business hours and is information that is not ordinarily available to the public, the information is taken to concern the personal affairs of an individual.

Accordingly, it is considered that disclosure of this information would be an unreasonable intrusion into the privacy rights of the individuals concerned.

If you are unhappy with this determination you are entitled to exercise your rights of external review with the Ombudsman SA. Alternatively, you can apply to the South Australian Civil and Administrative Tribunal (SACAT). If you wish to seek a review, you must do so within 30 calendar days of receiving this determination.

Introduction

- Good morning, everyone!
- It is a real pleasure to welcome you all to the Dairy Industry Association of Australia – South Australian Branch 2025 Breakfast.
- Welcome to special guests, the Hon Nicola Centofanti MLC, Ms Tori Dixon-Whittle, Chief Executive Officer of Food SA and Professor Mehdi Doroudi, Chief Executive of PIRSA.
- I would like to thank the Dairy Industry Association of Australia for inviting me to open today's event. It is always a pleasure, and such a valuable opportunity to reconnect, reflect on the year that's been, and achievements across the dairy sector.

- The Dairy Industry Association of Australia has always been about bringing people together; the farmers, processors, manufacturers, researchers and students who share a passion for dairy and for excellence.
- And here in South Australia, that spirit of collaboration runs deep. We are incredibly proud of our dairy industry. It remains one of the cornerstones of our state's food and beverage sector, generating more than \$760 million in revenue in the 2023-24 financial year, and supporting regional communities, families, and businesses right across the state.
- Your efforts produce world-class milk, cheese, yoghurt, and butter enjoyed in homes, cafés, and restaurants around Australia and increasingly around the world. In fact, our dairy exports totalled \$155 million in the 2024-25 financial year, reflecting both your reputation for quality and your growing global reach.
- Over the past year the dairy industry has achieved some very notable successes.
- At the 2025 South Australian Dairy Awards the industry recognised outstanding leadership and innovation.

- Congratulations to Narelle Zanker for her strong role in herd health and staff leadership on the family farm.
- In addition, congratulations to Reece Donhardt, the Innovative Farmer of the Year, for his progressive farming practices which set a strong benchmark for our sector and Brad Fischer for the sustainability award.

Dairy Action Plan Progress

- I also want to reflect on the South Australian Dairy Industry Action Plan 2024–2029, produced by the South Australian Dairyfarmers' Association and launched last year by the Premier.
- The Plan highlights premium products, exports development, and sustainability as key pillars of our future.
- Already we're seeing early progress, including stronger alignment across the supply chain, greater emphasis on sustainability, and work to strengthen industry engagement and traceability systems.

- Some of the strategic objectives include improving communication across the supply chain, improving training and succession pathways, growing milk production toward about 700 million litres, and position South Australia as “best of the best” in premium dairy.
- I understand progress continues on the industry’s aspiration to develop an industry centre of excellence. I continue to engage with all key stakeholders including the South Australian Dairy Association. The South Australian Government is aware of the importance of the project to the dairy industry.
- We are also continuing to work closely with the industry on its action plan goal for “Increased reach into Asian nations to develop markets for South Australian Dairy.” And stand ready to open up further market access opportunities as identified by industry. I know there

has been ongoing discussion to open access to countries including Indonesia and the Philippines in particular.

Acknowledging Challenges and Opportunity

- We also recognise that the past year hasn't been without its challenges from climate variability and input costs to broader market and workforce pressures.
- The collapse of Bostons Global Food Company impacted many South Australian dairy farmers and highlights the vulnerability of supply chains and processor risk.
- But what continues to set this industry apart is your resilience, your willingness to innovate, and your ability to adapt. Those qualities are at the heart of South Australian agriculture, and they're what keeps this sector strong.
- Despite challenging seasonal and economic conditions, South Australian dairy has continued to deliver high-quality milk and value-added products that consumers trust and love.

- This morning's program is particularly valuable in understanding and responding to evolving expectations, vital to securing SA's place in future markets.
- I look forward to continuing to working alongside you to build that future, supporting innovation, sustainability, and practical solutions that keep our producers and processors viable and thriving.

- Thank you once again for being here, and for everything you contribute to the strength and success of South Australian dairy. I look forward to an inspiring and productive morning together.
