

Proposed arrangements for Turbo Shell developmental fishing permit- DP001

1. The permit holder or the registered master may only take Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) by hand and only by diving from a registered boat from the coastal waters of fishing zones 3, 4 and 5. This excludes Aquatic Reserves, Marine Park sanctuary zones or restricted access zones (unless otherwise authorised under the *Marine Parks Act 2007*) and waters seaward of the line of Mean High Water Springs to a depth of 2 m in the area of a rocky reef.
2. The permit holder or the registered master may only take Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) provided that it is not less than 30 mm in shell length. All Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) must be landed in shell.
3. The authorised activity may only be conducted by the permit holder or the registered master, who must not undertake any other fishing activity whilst engaged in the authorised activity.
4. A maximum number of three registered masters may be endorsed on the permit. The permit holder or the registered master must not cause, suffer or permit more than 1 person (who must be a registered master) to engage in fishing activities under the permit on the same day. This condition does not prevent 1 other (and only 1 other) registered master from engaging in fishing activities on the same day as the first registered master provided that the 2 registered masters are not diving at the same time.
5. During the term of the permit, the permit holder or the registered master shall take no more than 20,000 kg of Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*), with no more than 12,000 kg taken from fishing zone 5.
6. The permit holder or the registered master must notify the Minister at least 1 hour prior to engaging in fishing activity and provide the following information – (a) the name of the person notifying the Minister; (b) the name of the registered master who will be conducting the authorised activity on that day; (c) details of the boat that will be used to engage in the authorised activity; (d) the location at which the authorised activities are to be engaged in; (e) the time and date the authorised activity will commence; (f) an estimated time of landing; and (g) the place of landing.
7. If the permit holder or the registered master is not able to land Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) within an hour of the estimated time of landing or place notified in accordance with condition 6 above, they must notify the Minister before the estimated time provided and provide a new time of landing or place of landing.
8. The permit holder or the registered master must not use more than 1 registered boat at any 1 time to take Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) or cause, suffer or permit more than 1 registered boat to be used at any 1 time to take Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) under the permit.
9. The permit holder or the registered master must not, on any 1 day, take Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) under the permit, or cause, suffer or permit Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) to be taken from more than 1 fishing zone.
10. The licence holder or the registered master must accurately weigh the catch and complete Part A of a CDR1 form at the conclusion of each fishing trip and within 200 metres of the place of landing.

He or she must ensure that a copy of CDR1 is delivered to the Minister within 48 hours of its completion.

11. The permit holder must ensure that all Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) taken under the permit are consigned or delivered to one of the registered fish processor listed on the Registrations and Entitlements register (of this permit).
12. Upon completion of the day's fishing activities the permit holder or the registered master must –
 - a. complete a periodic return, in a form determined by the Minister; and
 - b. include in the return such information as the Minister requires; and
 - c. date and sign the return and certify that information contained in the periodic return is complete and accurate, and deliver the periodic return to the Minister within 48 hours of its completion.
13. In accordance with condition 15, the permit holder or the registered master must –
 - a. make a copy of each periodic return that he or she completes before the periodic return is sent or delivered to the Minister; and
 - b. retain the copy for a period of 12 months from the last day of the month to which the periodic return relates.

Fishing zone 1 means the waters adjacent to South Australia west of the meridian of longitude 135° East;

Fishing zone 3 means the waters adjacent to South Australia between the meridians of longitude 136°30' East and 139° East;

Fishing zone 4 means the waters adjacent to South Australia between the meridians of longitude 139° East and 140°17' East;

Fishing zone 5 means the waters adjacent to South Australia east of the meridian of longitude 140°17' East;

Proposed arrangements for Turbo Shell developmental fishing permit – DP002

The permit holder or the registered master may only take Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) by hand from the coastal waters of fishing zone 1 or fishing zone 2. This excludes Aquatic Reserves, Marine Park sanctuary zones or restricted access zones (unless otherwise authorised under the *Marine Parks Act 2007*) and waters seaward of the line of Mean High Water Springs to a depth of 2 m in the area of a rocky reef.

1. The permit holder or the registered master must not take Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) that is less than 30 mm in shell length. All Turbo (*Turbo undulatus*) must be landed in shell.
2. The authorised activity may only be conducted by the permit holder or the registered master. No other fishing activity may be undertaken whilst engaged in the authorised activity.
3. A maximum number of three registered masters may be endorsed on the permit. The permit holder or the registered master must not cause, suffer or permit more than 1 person (who must be a registered master) to engage in fishing activities under the permit on the same day. This condition does not prevent 1 other (and only 1 other) registered master from engaging in fishing activities on the same day as the first registered master provided that the 2 registered masters are not diving at the same time.
