Snapshot

South Australia grows around **four million hectares of grain crop** each year, including wheat, barley, lentils and canola. **The farm gate value in 2022-23 reached \$4.77 billion.** Yields continue to grow while maintaining minimal impact on South Australia’s clean soils and water resources.

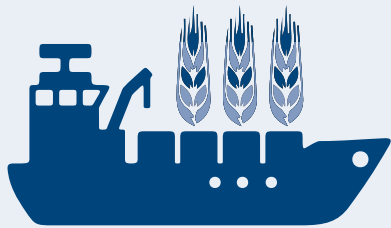

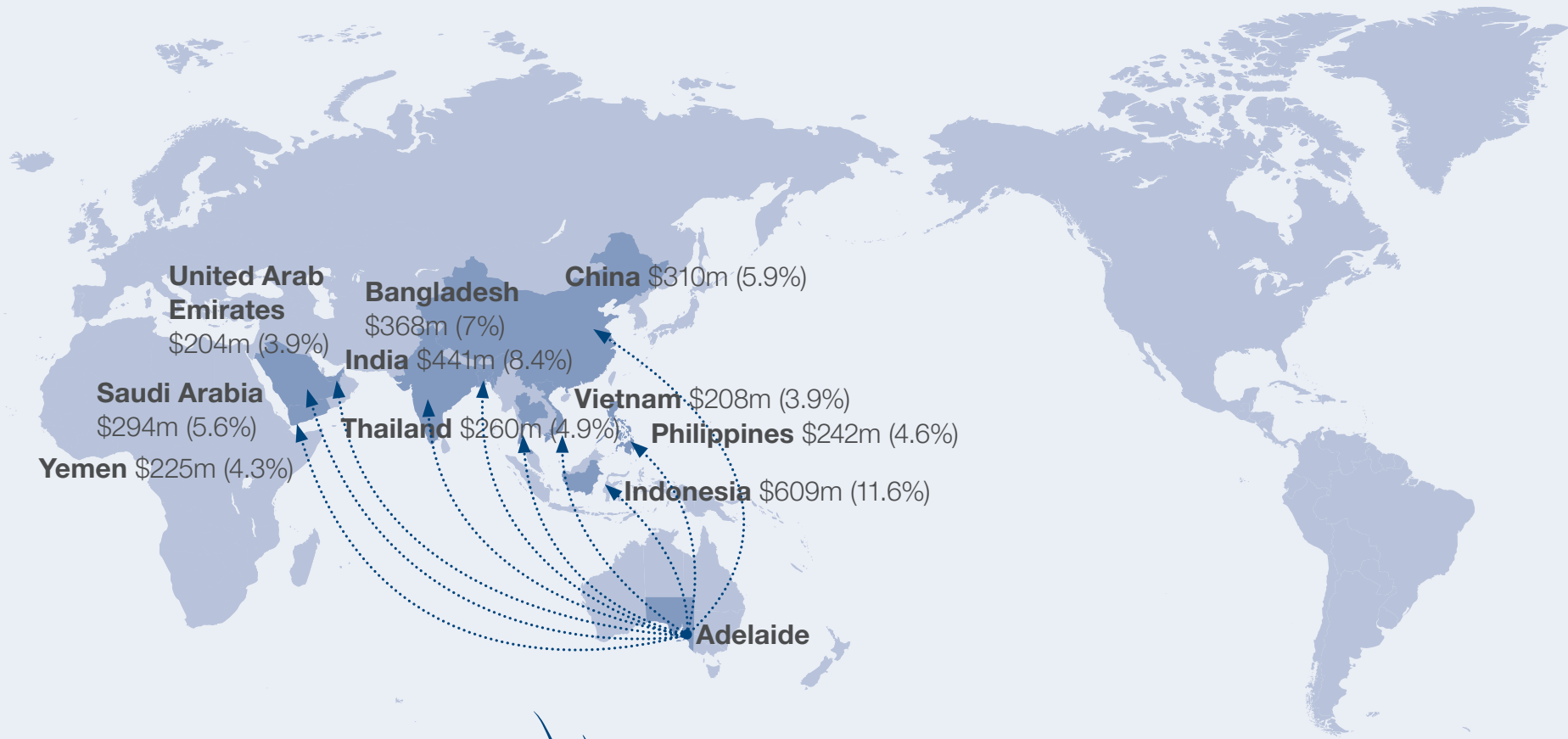

Barley

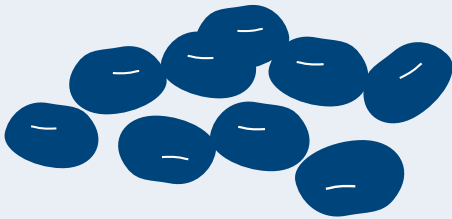
