
# South Australian Grains

#### **Snapshot**

South Australia grows around four million hectares of grain crop each year, including wheat, barley, lentils and canola. The farm gate value in 2022-23 reached \$4.77 billion. Yields continue to grow while maintaining minimal impact on South Australia's clean soils and water resources.
