The Act encourages disclosure of information to the public, subject to such restrictions within the Act as are necessary to protect legitimate agency, public and private interests.

Our agriculture, food, wine and forest industries are a major employer and our largest export sector accounting for more than half of the state's merchandise exports. Primary industries and agribusiness directly generated \$15.4 billion in revenue in 2020-21, which includes final sales from all primary production and associated processing.

Our regions make a substantial contribution to the state's economy, not only through agribusiness but also through mining and minerals processing, manufacturing, tourism and energy production.

Regional South Australia contributes about \$29 billion to the state's economy with just 27% of the state's population.
