

# Guide for exporting tomatoes, capsicums and chillies to WA/QLD



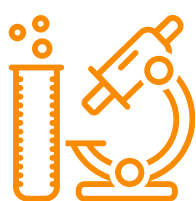

**Complete** the Expression of Intent form available on the Market Access page linked from [pir.sa.gov.au/tobrffv](http://pir.sa.gov.au/tobrffv) and send it to [PIRSA.TomatoMarketAccess@sa.gov.au](mailto:PIRSA.TomatoMarketAccess@sa.gov.au).



**Wait** for PIRSA to contact you to arrange sampling. PIRSA will arrange sampling no more than 10 days before harvest of first fruit.



PIRSA will send your samples to an approved laboratory for **testing**. You will not have to pay anything for these tests.



You can **pick** your crop while you wait for test results. Any crop you plan to export to QLD and/or WA must be kept separate.



If your test result returns as '**not detected**', PIRSA will contact you to arrange a Plant Health Certificate (PHC). Each consignment needs an individual PHC.



A PIRSA Plant Health Inspector will visit your facility to **certify** that any consignments you want to export meet the required standards. They will give you a PHC which you must send with your consignment.
