## NOTICE TO FISHERS

Dear Licence Holder in the Western Zone Abalone Fishery

### Ministerial exemption to take Roe's Abalone

I write in relation to the Ministerial exemption (ME9903123) to take *Haliotis roei* (Roe's Abalone) in 2021 pursuant to Section 115 of the *Fisheries Management Act 2007* (the Act).

As a delegate of the Minister for Primary Industries and Regional Development, I have approved a Ministerial exemption to be issued under Section 115 of the Act related to the harvest of Roe's Abalone. This exemption will apply effective from 1 January 2021 until 31 December 2021 unless varied or revoked earlier. The conditions of this exemption are similar to those in place in 2020.

You should note that your obligations under the Ministerial exemption includes the requirement to measure the first 50 shells of Roe's Abalone harvested each fishing day (or all shells when less than 50 Roe's Abalone have been caught on any one day) and to provide this information as instructed by SARDI. This information is important for consideration of longer-term management arrangements for the commercial harvest of Roe's Abalone.

The *Fisheries Management Act 2007* provides that it is an offence to breach a condition of an exemption. If compliance in relation to this Ministerial exemption is unsatisfactory, including reporting of biological data, then management arrangements for the activity including shucking at sea may be revoked.
