## PIRSA Algal Bloom Fee Relief Program

To support impacted commercial fishers and aquaculture operators, the Department of Primary Industries and Regions (PIRSA) has released the *Algal Bloom Fee Relief Program Guidelines*. These Guidelines outline who is eligible, what evidence is required, how to apply, and how relief will be assessed. They are designed to ensure a consistent and fair approach to providing support for individuals and businesses affected by the current Algal Bloom event.

Note these Guidelines have been updated in response to recent temporary, management arrangements. The updated Guidelines are applicable for Q1 to Q4 2026-27 financial year, commencing 1 July 2026.

### 1. About the Program

The South Australian Government is offering targeted fee relief for commercial fishers, aquaculture operators, and charter boat licence holders affected by the Algal Bloom.

### 2. Funding Available

Eligible operators may receive a credit or refund equivalent to 25% (for each impacted quarter) of their applicable (2026-27) annual fee.

- PIRSA Fisheries and Aquaculture annual licence fees
- Biosecurity SA Food Safety Scheme and audit fees
- Aquaculture lease and licence fees
- Fishery transaction fees.

#### Automatic Fee Relief – Gulf St Vincent/Kangaroo Island Fishing Zone

In line with the State Government's announcement of 30 April 2026, automatic fee relief will be provided to eligible licence holders affected by the temporary fishing closures and restrictions implemented in response to the algal bloom event. Fee relief applies across the following fisheries:

Licence holders of the Marine Scalefish and Charter Boat fisheries who have been impacted by the closure of the Gulf St Vincent / Kangaroo Island Fishing Zone, as well as the Gulf St Vincent Prawn Fishery, in response to the algal bloom event, will receive automatic fee relief for the 2026-27 financial year (Q1 – Q4). This means automatic approval and no need to apply for fee relief

through the Algal Bloom Fee Relief Review Group. This fee relief scenario is dependent on the below conditions:

- a. Licence holders with 100 or more combined quota units (King George Whiting, Southern Garfish, Southern Calamari) as of 1 July 2026 in the Gulf St Vincent / Kangaroo Island Fishing Zone will automatically be eligible for fee relief.
- b. Licence holders with less than 100 combined quota units (King George Whiting, Southern Garfish, Southern Calamari) as of 1 July 2026 in the Gulf St Vincent / Kangaroo Island Fishing Zone, however, have averaged at least 30% of their fishing days over the past three years in the Gulf St Vincent / Kangaroo Island Fishing Zone, will automatically be eligible for fee relief.
- c. Gulf St Vincent Prawn Fishery licence holders will automatically be eligible for fee relief.

### Automatic Fee Relief – Southern Calamari

Licence holders impacted by the closure of Southern Calamari fishing in the Spencer Gulf Fishing Zone in response to the algal bloom event will receive automatic fee relief for their Southern Calamari quota units for the 2026-27 financial year (Q1 – Q4).

### Automatic Fee Relief – Snapper

Licence holders impacted by the extended closure of Snapper fishing in the West Coast, Spencer Gulf, and Gulf St Vincent/Kangaroo Island fishing zones in response to the algal bloom event will receive automatic fee relief for their Snapper quota units for the 2026-27 financial year (Q1 – Q4).

### Other Lease and Licence Fee Relief

Fee relief reduces the annual lease and licence fees payable by all other affected licence holders. For 2026-27, relief is equivalent to 25% of the applicable annual fee for each quarter (Q1–Q4) that you are assessed as impacted by the algal bloom.

The Algal Bloom Fee Relief Review Group will continue to review fee relief applications from other licence holders on a weekly basis and assessing each impacted quarter at a time, until 30 June 2027.

### Fish Processor and Restricted Fish Processor Fee Relief

PIRSA will be providing additional support measures to impacted licence holders by extending the fee relief to include Fish Processor Registration fees. This will either be for the full year in the case of Gulf St Vincent impacted fisheries licence holders, or be a pro-rata arrangement for other impacted licence holders who have been assessed by the Algal Bloom Fee Relief Review Group, which includes Q1 – Q4 of 2026-27, with 25% of fee relief for each impacted quarter.

### Transactional Leasing and Licensing Application Fees

In addition to the fee relief arrangements outlined above, transactional Leasing and Licensing application fees for commercial fisheries sectors will not apply during the 2026–27 financial year. This includes both online and paper-based applications, such as quota transfers, boat variation applications and other transactional licensing transactions.

This fee relief applies to commercial fisheries sectors only and will remain in place until 30 June 2027.

Application fees for aquaculture-related transactions are not included in this arrangement and will continue to apply in accordance with the prescribed fee schedule for the 2026–27 financial year.

### 3. Eligible Applicants

To be eligible for fee relief, applicants must:

- Hold a current commercial fishery licence, aquaculture lease/licence, or charter boat licence issued by PIRSA;
- Have experienced operational impacts due to the Algal Bloom event;
- Submit an application via an industry association (e.g., MFA, SAPFA, SAOGA), or directly to PIRSA;
- Not have already received relief for the same fees via other government schemes.

### 4. Application Information

Applications can be submitted up to **30 June 2027**.

Applications can include:

- Areas typically fished or farmed, compared to impacted zones (as identified by Fishwatch and SARDI reporting);
- Catch history for **2023, 2024, and 2025**;
- Additional supporting information such as:
  - Fishing days lost
  - Disruption to operations
  - Business or personal financial impacts.

*Note: These are guidelines only. PIRSA will consider other evidence that credibly demonstrates impact and will assess catch history from CDRs and catch and effort returns. However, for operators still submitting paper logbooks, PIRSA may not yet have access to their most recent data, particularly for April–June 2025. Where this is the case, applicants are encouraged to submit any recent returns or other relevant documentation to support their application.*

### 5. Assessment Process

Applications will be assessed by PIRSA's **Fee Relief Review Group**, comprising senior officers

from regulatory, finance, and legislative teams.

The following approach will be applied:

- **Outcome model:** applicants are either eligible or ineligible, based on evidence.
- Relief will be issued as **25% of total eligible annual fees**, representing the affected quarter
- Assessments will be conducted on a **rolling basis**, with recommendations submitted weekly for approval.

## 6. Examples of Relief Amounts

Below are average annual fees and corresponding relief amounts for the most impacted sectors:

Sector	Annual Fee	Approx. Relief (25%)
Marine Scalefish Fishery	\$7,500	\$1,875
Charter Boat Fishery	\$2,646	\$661
Oyster Aquaculture	\$2,294	\$573

## 7. How Relief Will Be Applied

Relief will be issued either as:

- A **credit** applied to current debt or future invoices; or
- A **refund**, upon request.

The choice of mechanism will be confirmed with each eligible operator.
