

RECREATIONAL SHORT TERM ROCK LOBSTER POT APPLICATION FORM (CHARTER BOAT USE)

Fisheries Management Act 2007

Recreational short term rock lobster pots may only be used by the registration holder under regulation 10 of the Fisheries Management (General) Regulations 2017, or by a Charter Boat Fishery licence holder (including registered master) on behalf of the registration holder, consistent with Ministerial exemption ME9903416. Short term rock lobster pots are registered on a short term basis for use only under a charter boat fishing agreement.

INSTRUCTIONS TO APPLICANTS

Timing of submission.

Applications must be submitted at least 2 business days before the pot(s) are intended to be set. The operator of the charter should advise you of the latest date for submission based on when they intend to set the pot(s).

Payments by credit card may only be made using Visa or Mastercard only.

INSTRUCTIONS TO POT REGISTRATION HOLDERS

You must have a valid rock lobster pot registration (and valid tags fitted to each pot) before you can use a recreational rock lobster pot in South Australian waters. Your rock lobster pot must comply with Fisheries Regulations.

A numbered tag issued by PIRSA **MUST BE** attached to the top of the rope near the float, so that it is visible above the surface of the water, when the pot is in use.

Only one short term rock lobster pot registration can be issued per person, with a maximum of two pots per registration.

Please note: this registration is an 'authority' for the purposes of section 116 of the *Fisheries Management Act 2007* and as such the registration holders full name and postal address will appear on the public register.

Rock Lobster Fishing Seasons 2026/2027

Southern Zone - is open from 6:00am 1 October 2026 to 6:00pm 31 May 2027.

Northern Zone - is open from 12 noon 1 November 2026 to 6:00pm 31 May 2027.

Please Note:

If approved, a registration for a recreational short term rock lobster pot will be issued for a period specified by the Minister in the registration certificate, based on the date/s of the charter boat fishing agreement (the Charter trip). A copy of your registration certificate will be provided to you via email, as well as to the Charter Boat Fishery licence holder to advise them that registration has been approved and the tags can be operated.
