

Fisheries Management (Marine Scalefish Fisheries) Regulations 2017

For the purpose of regulation 31 relating to catch and disposal requirements – Blue Swimmer Crab – I make the following determinations –

**Regulation 31(1)(a) (record information) and Regulation 31(1)(c) (arrangements for fish)**

- (1) The holder of a licence in respect of the fishery or registered master of a boat from which Blue Swimmer Crab is taken under such a licence must comply with the following provisions:
  - (a) immediately on landing Blue Swimmer Crab taken under the licence he or she must weigh the Blue Swimmer Crabs on accurate scales and complete Part A of the Blue Crab Catch and Disposal Record 1 (BSCF1) using a blue or black ballpoint pen;
  - (b) he or she must cause the Blue Swimmer Crabs to which the completed Part A of that record relates to be transported to the registered premises of the registered fish processor specified on the record, together with the white, blue and green copies of the completed BSCF1;
  - (c) he or she must complete forms BSCF1 in consecutive ascending order and complete all forms in a CDR book before commencing to use a new CDR book;
  - (d) he or she must ensure that the yellow copies of forms BSCF1 and the CDR book are kept on board the registered boat until the CDR book is completed;
- (2) Blue Swimmer Crabs taken pursuant to a Marine Scalefish Fishery licence must not be returned to a registered boat or a holding cage or a corf in the waters of the state once the Blue Swimmer Crabs have been weighed and the certified weight has been recorded on Part B of the record BSCF 1.
- (3) All Blue Swimmer Crabs taken pursuant to this licence must be consigned to one of the registered fish processors listed on the Registrations and Entitlements register in relation to this licence for weighing within the State of South Australia.

**Regulation 31(1)(b) (provide information)**

- (1) The licence holder must notify or ensure that the registered master notifies PIRSA Fishwatch on 1800 065 522 prior to the commencement of each days Blue Swimmer Crab quota fishing activity and provide the following information:
  - (a) The name of the person making the call;
  - (b) The commercial fishery licence number and the registered number of the boat;

- (c) The date and time of the fishing activity; and
  - (d) Location at which the boat is to be launched and retrieved.
- (2) The holder of a licence in respect of the fishery or registered master of a boat from which Blue Swimmer Crab is taken under such a licence must deliver a completed CDR book to the Department by posting to;

within 14 days of its completion.

**Regulation 31(3) (keeping of records)**

- (1) The holder of a licence in respect of a marine scalefish fishery subject to a condition fixing a Blue Swimmer Crab quota entitlement must –
- (a) make a copy of each BCF1 record that he or she completes under this determination before the return is sent or delivered; and
  - (b) retain the copy for a period of 12 months from the last day of the month to which the return relates.
